A Brief History

A Brief History Barter Theatre was founded during the Great Depression by Robert Porterfield, an enterprising young actor. When Porterfield and some of his actor friends found themselves out of work and hungry in New York City, Porterfield suggested they sojourn to his home in southwest Virginia where there was an abundance of food but no live theatre. He returned to Washington County with an extraordinary proposition: bartering produce from the farms and gardens of the area to gain admission to see a play.

Barter Theatre opened its doors on June 10, 1933 proclaiming, "With vegetables you cannot sell, you can buy a good laugh." The price of admission was 40 cents or the equivalent in produce; the concept of trading "ham for Hamlet" caught on quickly. At the end of the first season, the Barter Company cleared \$4.35 in cash, two barrels of jelly and enjoyed a collective weight gain of over 300 pounds.

In 1946, Barter Theatre was designated the state theatre of Virginia and became a launching pad for the careers of many iconic actors and actresses. Barter has also become one of the nation's longest running professional theatres, receiving countless awards and accolades.

Robert Porterfield passed away in 1971. His successor, Rex Partington, a former Barter actor and stage manager, became Barter's chief administrator from 1972 until his retirement in 1992. In October 1992, Richard Rose was named the Producing Artistic Director. During his tenure, attendance grew from 42,000 to more than 163,000 annual patrons. Significant capital improvements were also made, including renovation of the main stage (now Gilliam Stage) in 1995 and the 2006 addition of The Barter Café at Stage II (now the Smith Theatre).



Rose also created Barter's Equity Resident Acting Company, who performs year-round, as well as a company of designers and technicians. Rose retired in December of 2019 and Katy Brown, who had been at Barter since 1998 as the Director of the Barter Players and Associate Artistic Director, was named the fourth Producing Artistic Director – and is the first woman to hold the position.

Barter represents two distinct venues of live theatre: Barter Theatre's Gilliam Stage, and Barter's Smith Theatre. Gilliam Stage, with over 500 seats, features traditional theatre in a luxurious setting. Barter's Smith Theatre offers seating for 167 around a thrust stage in an intimate setting and is perfect for more adventurous productions. Barter Theatre is also home to The Barter Players, a talented ensemble of actors who produce plays for young audiences throughout the year.

In 2020, during the global pandemic, Barter was able to continue producing by creating a new venue at the Moonlite Drive-in, where the audience sat safely distanced in their parking spots while watching the actors on stage/simulcast on the big screen. History is always in the making at Barter Theatre, building on legends of the past; Barter looks forward to the challenge of growth in the future.

Sarah grew up in Hong Kong, Belgium, and South Carolina. Now based in South Philadelphia, she's a playwright, bookwriter, and lyricist. She began writing musicals, first as a bookwriter, then as a lyricist, and subsequently won the Kleban Prize in Musical Theatre for lyric writing. She wrote the book and lyrics for Theatreworks USA's Pete the Cat (Off-Broadway; four national tours) and the book for String (Village Theatre World Premiere 2018; Richard Rodgers Award; NAMT).

String was developed at the O'Neill Music Theatre Conference, NAMT '14, and theinaugural Oscar Hammerstein Festival at the Bucks County Playhouse. String also won the Frederick Loewe Award at New Dramatists, a NAMT residency grant, the Weston Playhouse New Musicals Award, and the Richard Rodgers Prize. Sarah has been the recipient of an Uncharted Residency at Ars Nova, the Lippmann Family "New Frontier" Award, Actors Theatre of Louisville's Heideman Award, commissions from South Coast Repertory and Broadway Across America, and a residency at The Royal National Theatre in London. About the Composer: Will Aronson





- French is the official language, and the Euro (€) is the currency.


Famous Foods

Jimmy and his classmates each have to paint a masterpiece of anything they want. Create your own masterpiece in the frame below.




Discussion Questions

- 2. How does Pete show that he is a good friend to Jimmy? Can you think of a time when you helped a friend?
- 3. Jimmy is nervous about the art test but tries painting anyway. Have you ever done something new that made you nervous? What happened?
- 5. The Biddle family welcomes Pete into their home, even though they are unsure about getting a cat. How do they show kindness and care?
- 4. Pete takes Jimmy on an adventure in the VW Bus to find inspiration. If you could go on an adventure anywhere, where would you go and why?
- 4. Jimmy has many rules for his room, but he learns to relax a little when Pete moves in. Why is it important to listen and compromise with others?
- 4. Jimmy copies someone else's painting but learns to make his own. Why is it better to create something yourself instead of copying?
